
MEET OUR TEAM

The Workforce Development Strategic Solutions (WDSS) Team at R.J. Leeper is actively engaged with trade partners and community training programs to facilitate the employment of qualified individuals to current construction projects and improve upward mobility within the local construction workforce. PROJECT SPOTLIGHT:

THE PEARL INNOVATION DISTRICT



Construction will take place at the intersection of Baxter and McDowell Streets in Brooklyn Village. This phase of The Pearl project consists of Parking Garage A, an 8-level, 200,000 GSF, 554 space precast parking deck intended to serve the adjacent Research One and Center for Education buildings. Future phases will be released very soon, which involve landscaping, hardscaping, pavers, asphalt, signage & wayfinding.

The History of Brooklyn Village

Brooklyn Village, formerly known simply as 'Brooklyn', was once a thriving black community. Filled with lively shops, schools, and church's, Brooklyn had a life of its own. The prominent area was destroyed during the 1960s and 1970s due to The Urban Renewal Act, displacing thousands of residents and ultimately demolishing 1,484 structures. The name "The Pearl" is intended to pay homage to the rich history of Brooklyn, the "city within a city".





Nestled near Brooklyn lied Good Samaritan Hospital (GSH), a privately funded, independent hospital built exclusively for and staffed by Blacks in North Carolina. In 1961, GSH became Charlotte Community Hospital, which was also associated with Charlotte Memorial Hospital, now known as Atrium Health. Though the original GSH building is gone, the memories remain. As Atrium Health leads the development partnership of The Pearl, it is our hope to be apart of the lasting legacy of Brooklyn. Over the next 15 years, The Pearl is projected to create more than 5,500 onsite jobs – 40% of which are not expected to require a college degree – and more than 11,500 jobs, in total, in the Charlotte community.
